Are you protecting your home network, computers, tablets, and phones from cyber criminals? Read on to learn how you can make your home safer during the COVID-19 crisis.

You might be using personal devices for remote City work. These devices need to be protected - vaccinated - against advanced threats of today and increased attacks related to COVID-19. Even City issued computers live on the home network, together with your other devices, owned by your partners, spouses, and children. All of these devices need protection to ensure that a cyber attacker can't steal your personal data, destroy your photos, and infect City systems.

The City Cybersecurity team is providing you, our City workers, Advanced Security software for **free** in partnership with a leading consumer brand, ZoneAlarm. Advanced Security goes beyond the traditional anti-virus software

offered on Windows PCs or through cable/internet providers and protects you against ransomware and phishing attacks. All of your personal devices: PCs, tablets and phones (Android and iOS), are covered, and no data will ever be shared with the City.

## Voluntary, free, and strongly encouraged: Program available for limited time only!

Please follow the simple steps below to start protecting your home devices:

- 1. Go to MyApps.sfgov.org (if it's your first time, you can explore many other resources for remote work).
- 2. Click on the Advanced Home Security tile.
- 3. Register your email for the program.
- 4. Receive email with a registration code and installation links.
- 5. Install ZoneAlarm on all your devices.
- 6. Enjoy knowing that you are protecting yourself, your family and the City for the next year.

If you need any help with registration or installation, go to the <u>ZoneAlarm</u> <u>support page</u>. Support is available Monday-Friday 24/5 and Saturday-Sunday 8am-5pm.
