Sorry for missing this. James and I just spoke.

- The first question involves the design of the Balboa Reservoir Project Variant 4 (the relocation of North Access Road, screenshot included in this email as an attachment). There was some discussion about whether the North Access Road/Frida Kahlo Way intersection would be a stopsign or a signal-controlled intersection. Planning's thought was that it would remain a signalcontrolled intersection – is this assumption correct? We understand that the project will be relocating the signal to this new intersection.
- 2. The second question involves discussion of a raised crosswalk on Lee Avenue, just north of the truck turnaround (emails included below). Would you please let us know if MTA would support any traffic calming or control feature (e.g., raised crosswalk, stop sign, traffic signal, etc.) at this location? The project should clarify the intended path of travel, not routing pedestrians through the truckturn around. There should be a clear path of travel for peds that is separate from where the trucks are. We are happy to look at a crosswalk (raised is fine)—it doesn't seem like it needs a signal, but possibly a rectangular rapid flashing beacon.
